Select FIN 4234, FIN 4244, FIN 4264, and FIN 4144. FIN 4104 must be taken instead of FIN 4244 if FIN 4244 is not a WI approved course.

### **FINANCIAL SERVICES MANAGEMENT TRACK**

Select FIN 4254, FIN 4264, and FIN 4144. Select either FIN 4224 or FIN 4234. FIN 4104 must be taken instead of FIN 4254 if FIN 4254 is not a WI approved course.

### **FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING TRACK**

Select ACIS 3116, ACIS 3215 and two Finance courses from the elective courses below with at least one being an in-major WI approved course.

### **GENERAL FINANCE TRACK**

Select 12 Semester Hours from the Elective courses below. At least 6 hours must be Finance courses with at least one being an in-major WI approved course.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This checklist applies to students completing their degrees in calendar year 2007 in the terms ending May, June, July, or December. A total of **125 Semester Hours (SH)** is required for graduation. At least 50% of the curriculum should be taken in general education courses (all courses outside the Pamplin College of Business plus BIT 2405-6. All economics courses are outside the college). To meet this criteria, **students must take at least 13 Semester Hours of the 21 Semester Hours free electives outside** the departments of ACIS, BIT, FIN, MGT, and MKTG. Any exceptions to this curriculum must be approved by the student's Department Head and the Pamplin College of Business Associate Dean for Undergraduate Programs.

**In-Major GPA:** The GPA in the Finance Major includes all College of Business junior and senior core courses, and all courses required for the major. These courses are marked with # above. In order to graduate, students must have an in-major GPA of at least 2.0.

**Transferring Courses:** At least 50% of all Business credits (any courses taken in ACIS, BIT, FIN, MGT, and MKTG) required for the degree must be taken at Virginia Tech. Additional requirements and procedures for transferring courses are available in the University Catalog and the Pamplin College of Business form, Authorization to Take Courses Elsewhere.

**Language Requirement:** See "Entrance Requirements," University Catalog.

### **FOOTNOTES**

- <sup>1</sup> Prior to enrolling in junior business courses, students must: have earned at least 60 semester hours; have a GPA of 2.0 or better in the combined series in MATH, ACIS, BIT, and ECON courses, have no grade lower than a C- in any of these courses; and have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better for all coursework. In order to graduate, students must have an overall GPA of at least 2.0.
- <sup>2</sup> In addition to the Freshman English/Communication Skills requirement, students entering before Fall 2005 must complete another six credit hours from approved Writing Intensive (WI) courses, three of which must be in the student's major (see senior year).
- <sup>3</sup> Equivalent Math courses may be substituted. Completes the University Core Requirement in Area 5: Quantitative and Symbolic Reasoning.
- <sup>4</sup> Effective for students entering Fall 2003 and thereafter, there has been an administrative waiver of the two credit hours of related laboratory courses as stipulated in Area 4 of the Undergraduate University Core. IMPORTANT NOTE: This waiver does not eliminate any credit hours from the total 125 credits required for graduation. The 2 credit hours eliminated from Area 4 must be made up as free electives.
- <sup>5</sup> Social science courses can be selected from any course in Economics (beyond Principles), Geography, History (except HIST 1024, 1026, or 2054), International Studies, Political Science (except PSCI 3015-3016), Psychology, and Sociology; or any course approved for Area 3 of the University Core.
- <sup>6</sup> ECON 2005 and 2006 will satisfy the University Core Requirement in Area 3: Society and Human Behavior.
- <sup>7</sup> COMM 2004 Public Speaking is required for all Business majors who did not take COMM 1015-1016. It may be completed in the sophomore or junior year.
- <sup>8</sup> Free electives must include at least one-hour from the University Core Area 6: Creativity and Aesthetic Experience. The University Core Area 7: Critical Issues in A Global Context, may be used to meet another requirement or taken as a free elective.
- <sup>9</sup> Prior to enrolling in these courses the student must have earned a grade of C or better in FIN 3134.
- <sup>10</sup> Designated as case/project intensive courses.
- <sup>11</sup> Prior to enrolling in these elective courses the student must have earned a grade of C or better in each of FIN 3144 and FIN 3154.
